

### **The Vicar Writes**

On 15<sup>th</sup> June, people in our community woke to hear the devastating news that a young girl had died in the Etherow River, in Broadbottom, the previous evening. I have been reflecting on the ensuing events over the last few days and I would like to share some of my thoughts with you in this article.

Soon after the news of the girl's death became known, there was a flurry of social media as people shared the story and tried to ascertain who knew her, who would be most affected by the news, and who would need support. These are all very commendable reactions and are often the response in communities when people try to work out the most appropriate way to respond. It became clear that the girl's family had not disclosed her name, and with continued respect, I will not use her name here. However, on the day I and others in the church were continually asked by the press to confirm who she was. We were aware of the family's wishes at this point in time, and therefore we did not mention her name to the press. It was not our place to do so.

I reflected on how we source our information in today's age, and what and with whom we share on social media. It is a natural response to be curious about people, but sometimes our curiosity gets the better of us.

The church's response was to open the Magdalene Centre with a book of condolences there, to provide a place for quiet reflection and prayer, a safe place for grief to be held, and the opportunity to light a candle for the girl and her family. At the same time, with so much information being shared online, there was also a need to keep abreast of events, and how, as a church, we should continue to respond. Consequently I discovered a tension between the need for respectful silence and the need for up-todate information. I have reflected that I didn't personally get that balance right all of the time.

Another thing I noticed about people's responses was the endless flow of 'Could have...should have...would have' that circulated. The modern human tendency of 'who can we blame for this?' came quickly to the fore. For example, people were asking if schools or councils do enough to educate children of the dangers. My experience is that pointing out where others have possibly overlooked something will not bring comfort to those who are grieving and possibly may add to their own thoughts of 'what could I have done differently?' These are words I have heard so many times at funeral visits, 'I could have done...if only I got there quicker...maybe if I had insisted that the doctors did more...' It is often the case that there is something to learn from a tragedy of this nature, and responses can be made in the days to come, but I am not sure that this is the best time to voice it.

My final reflection is to encourage us to do something that is becoming harder and harder for most of us. I would like to encourage us, in times of sadness and loss, to switch off our phones, even if it is just for a short while. This may give us the space to pause in our grief and sorrow and fear, and listen to our own hearts and the gentle voice of God rather than the endless notification clamour emitting from our mobiles.

In this space we may be able to give time to emotions and internal responses which are crucial not to ignore. We are able to pray for those who are grieving or in shock and for those who respond to the situation and offer care. We can also think carefully about what is and is not ours to share with other people, to refrain from offering insights and opinions that will not prove helpful and will only add to the maelstrom of noisy information.

We continue to hold in our prayers the girl's family and all who are deeply touched by this sad event in the midst of our local community. As we look ahead to the summer to come, I pray for all our young people, that they may have a fun, safe summer and a well-earned break.



# St Michael's Churchyard

# There is a serious problem with dog fouling in the Parish Churchyard.

Dog dirt is being walked into school by small children cutting through the churchyard on their way to Mottram Primary School. This is dangerously unhygienic.

The mess is also making things very unpleasant for the churchyard and memorial garden maintenance teams, all of whom are unpaid volunteers.

Dog owners are very welcome to exercise their pets in the churchyard but please keep your dog under close control and clear up any mess.

If you live nearby and let your dog out to relieve itself in the morning, please ensure that it does so in your own garden/ on your own land.

We ask everyone to remember that Mottram Churchyard is a designated Public Space and therefore subject to Tameside bylaws. Allowing your dog to foul the churchyard could result in a fixed penalty notice enforced by Tameside Council. A first offence would cost £80. A second offence, or failure to pay the £80 fine, would cost £1,000. Please, think on and be considerate.

Congratulations to Louise Britton, our Children and Families Missioner, on achieving a Tameside grant to set up an All-ages Chess Club in the parish. Here's the story in her own words:

"In my other job outside Children and Families Missioner I teach chess in primary schools and over the past few months have been asked by numerous people if I teach chess to adults. After about ten people had contacted me I thought I must listen and pray about it.

This then led to me applying for a grant within Tameside to set up a community All-age Chess Club.



Around March this year I also started a free chess club at Mottram Primary School and each week have between 25 and 40 children choosing to play chess in their lunch break.

In early June the All-age Chess Club was shortlisted. I presented the project to a panel who loved the idea and voted for the funding to go ahead!

I am so excited to bring all ages together in the community, playing a game of chess and meeting up over a brew to learn,



socialise and get back to human contact.

A big thank you to Sharron Power, our Community Partnerships officer, for her support and encouragement with the bid.

The funding is expected to come through in a couple of months. Watch this space!"


