Heritage Open Day 2023

Inside the church - Guided Tours, Delicious Cakes and Refreshments, Art Exhibition, Bargain Bookstall, Jewellery and Make-up, Raffles, Bottle Tombola, – an atmosphere of fun and joy.

Outside - A perfect day. Warm sun, fluffy white clouds, Jackie Smith's sizzling barbecue and amazing displays of determination and bravery.

Bravery? Nay - pluck, courage and fortitude in the face of danger. A constant queue of teddy bears and other cherished toys stilled their pounding hearts and faced the ultimate test. The zip-wire challenge!!!

I could not prevent a tear coming to my eye as I witnessed the collective heroism of these cuddly toys.

At the top of the tower was zip-meister Tony Kershaw, hard hat gleaming in the afternoon sun. Down below was Chris Kneen (also suitably clad in appropriate and risk-compliant protective gear) giving us a hilarious running commentary on the unfolding drama.

The challengers gave their details (true or otherwise) to Jacqui Kneen and were loaded into an impressive wicker basket. No time for going back now! The rope tautens, the basket lifts and the first teddies swing up, up, up, hauled by the muscled sinews of Tony, their temporary guardian.

Seconds later they are clipped to the wire hawser. The crowd below joins in the countdown. 'Three! Two! One! Go!' roar the onlookers. Down, down, down hurtle the teddies. Touchdown! Elation ! Back in the loving arms of their owners!

Many are the tales of these furry challengers. One teddy insisted on competing even though he had only one ear. Imagine! Only one ear! Others – donkeys, camels and Spidermen masquerading as teddies (and probably giving false ages too) insisted on taking part even though they did not fulfil the strict criteria for qualification.

Records were broken that day. An Angel Bear floated ethereally down in serene solitude, John Wayne Teddy showed true grit, and three teddies (Blind Teddy, Little Teddy and Black Bear) with an astonishing combined age of 272 years, came down together as coolly as if they did this sort of thing every week. It is rumoured that as many as five participants crammed into one basket, but the organisers categorically state that no teddy (or toy) was injured in the course of the afternoon.





High Days & Holy Days

St Luke - 18th October

'Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, bless the bed that I lie on' - my grandma taught me that one. At least it meant I never forgot the names of the writers of the four Gospels. This month Luke, the writer of the third of them, has his feast day -18th October.

He was, we learn from the letters of St Paul, a 'physician' - an educated man and probably the only one of the writers of the New Testament who was not a Jew. In modern terms, he was Turkish. Paul took him as one of his

missionary team on a long journey around the Middle East, and they clearly became close friends. Under house arrest later in his life Paul could write, 'only Luke is with me'.

However, it is his Gospel which has established him as a major figure in the history of the Christian Church. Mark's Gospel may have more drama, Matthew's more prophetic background and John's a more profound sense of the mystery of the divine, but Luke offers us a Jesus who is utterly and believably real. This man turned no one away, reserved his harshest words for hypocrites and religious grandees, cared for the marginalised, the poor, the persecuted, the handicapped and the sinful. His Gospel is full of people we can recognise - indeed, in whom we can often recognise ourselves.

Try, for instance, the story of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). Read it not as a sacred text but as a brilliant piece of story-telling: subtle repetitions ('your son, this brother of yours'), believable characters, drama and profound emotion. There is the older brother, so cynical about his sibling's alleged reformation, the 'prodigal' himself, so hesitant about throwing himself on his father's mercy after the folly of his earlier behaviour, and there is the father, abandoning the dignity of his role in the family and actually running to welcome his wretched son's return.

In Luke's Gospel there are more poor people, more lepers, more 'sinners' and tax-collectors; more 'outsiders' who are shown to be 'inside' the love of Christ. This, for many of us, is the great Gospel of inclusion and compassion. Here is a Jesus for the whole world and for every one of us. Thank you, Dr Luke!






The Collection Basket
